The ideal candidate will have a proven ability to foster coordination among diverse stakeholders, manage multiple projects, and ensure that policies and initiatives center those most impacted by climate change.

As Deputy Director, you will work closely with the State Director to support coalition partners in achieving shared goals, facilitate collaboration, and ensure that resources are deployed effectively to build a just and sustainable clean energy future in New Jersey. This position offers an exciting opportunity to contribute directly to advancing policy in energy, transportation, and environmental justice sectors.

Key Responsibilities:
