### **The Science Advisory Board**

AGENCY: The Environmental Protection Agency

BACKGROUND: The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is seeking nominations for the [Science Advisory Board \(SAB\)](#). The SAB is a federally chartered advisory body that provides independent scientific and technical advice to the EPA Administrator on environmental issues to help ensure agency actions are grounded in sound science. Experts are sought with experience in the following disciplines: “air quality; agricultural sciences and economics; analytical chemistry; atmospheric sciences; benefit-cost analysis; biostatistics; citizen science; community environmental health; dose-response assessment; drinking water; drinking water engineering; ecological sciences; ecological risk assessment; ecosystem services; economics; energy and the environment; engineering; epidemiology; exposure assessment; forestry; geochemistry; health sciences; human health risk assessment; hydrology; hydrogeology; medicine; microbiology; modeling; pediatrics; chemical risk assessment, public health; physiologically based pharmacokinetic (PBPK) modeling; risk assessment; social, behavioral and decision sciences; statistics; sustainability; radiological risk assessment; toxicology; uncertainty analysis; water quality; water quantity and reuse; and waste management.” Members selected to the chartered SAB may also participate on standing committees, including: The Agricultural science Committee, the Chemical Assessment Advisory Committee, the Drinking Water Committee and the Economic Analysis Committee.

Nominations must include contact information, description of expertise, a curriculum vitae, and a biographical sketch. Individuals may be self-nominated or nominated by a third party.

**BACKGROUND:** The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is seeking nominations for the [Clean Air Scientific Advisory Committee](#). The CASAC is a federally chartered advisory body established under the *Clean Air Act* to provide independent scientific advice to the EPA Administrator on air quality criteria and National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS), including recommendations for new or revised standards, research needs, and potential impacts of regulatory strategies. Experts are sought with experience in the following disciplines: “air quality, biostatistics, ecology, environmental engineering, epidemiology, exposure assessment, medicine, risk assessment, and/or toxicology.”

Nominations must include a current curriculum vitae and biological sketch. Individuals may be self-nominated or nominated by a third party.

### **Human Studies Review Board**

**BACKGROUND:** The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is seeking nominations for the [Human Studies Review Board \(HSRB\)](#). The HSRB seeks to provide the EPA with advice, information, and recommendations related to issues involving scientific and ethnic aspect of “human subjects research.” The main responsibilities of the board include “research proposals and protocols that include human subjects; and reports of completed research with human subjects.” Main areas of interest for the HSRB include pesticide studies, worker exposure studies, janitorial maintenance personnel, and field efficacy studies for skin insect repellent.

Nominations must include resume with information about leadership positions in any national associations or societies, relevant research experience, list of publicans, and a short (one page) biography describing how the nominee meets the criteria outlined in the notice. A nominee’s contact information must also be provided including business address, email address and phone number. Individuals may be self-nominated
